Parental Survey Feedback

A huge thank you to all the parents who completed our recent feedback survey. We're thrilled to share that the responses were overwhelmingly positive! Parents told us their children are happy (100%) and feel safe (99%) at school, and that we maintain high expectations (99%) and strong communication (99%). Nearly all parents feel their concerns are addressed properly (97%) and that their child is doing well (99%). Thank you for the individual comments shared as well as these make the percentages above even more personal. They have been shared with all staff as well. The feedback is also so vital in terms of us identifying ways we can continue to improve and we will be looking at these over the coming weeks.

If you ever do have a concern, there is always a channel to follow to raise this; firstly, through class teachers, then team leaders (Mrs Harrison and Mrs McGhee) and our SENDCO (Mrs Sumner), then to myself and following that our board of governors.

Finally, we are especially proud that 100% would recommend our school to others. Your feedback helps us continue to grow and support every child to thrive—thank you for being such a vital part of our school community!
