The boys continued their season when they travelled to Holy Rosary Primary School and, although they lost 7-1, the team played well against a very strong side. The boys grew in confidence as the game went on and Matthew's goal in the second half was a worthy reward for their efforts. Player Of The Match went to Jake for a brilliant performance in goal where he pulled off a number of outstanding saves. The girls' team also played against Holy Rosary Primary School on the same night and, despite missing several players through injury and illness, the team managed to keep their unbeaten run going by drawing 0-0. Every player played brilliantly and the girls were desperately unlucky not to win it when Jess struck the crossbar with a fantastic shot in the second half. Player Of The Match was a tough decision but it went to Alexa who was imperious at the back, refusing to let anyone get past her and starting off lots of attacks with her passing out from the back.
